

Summer Fun in Rangeley

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Boating in Rangeley



Nothing can top being on the lake in the summer! We have a number of large lakes in the area, and even more smaller bodies of water to enjoy! From kayaking to pontooning, fishing to water skiing, there's something everyone will enjoy on our beautiful lakes and ponds!

Public Launches- Bigger Bodies of Water

Rangeley Lake

There are three public launches on Rangeley Lake. The first is in the center of Rangeley on Park Street across from the Post Office. The second is on Route 4 just before you go into Oquossoc Village on the left. The third is at the State park, on South Shore Drive.

Beaver Mountain Lake

The launch for Beaver Mountain Lake is on Route 4 about 5 miles south of Rangeley. There is a small bridge where the pond meets the road and boats can be launched beside the bridge on the right side of the road!

Mooselookmeguntic Lake

There are two public launches on Mooselookmeguntic. The first is at the end of Route 4 in Oquossoc, Haines Landing. The second is on Bemis Road. Follow for about 7 miles, then after the skinny bridge turn right onto Shelton's Trail. Follow for approx. 3 miles, launch is on the right with lots of parking!

Aziscohos Lake

The major access ramp for this lake is at Black Brook Cove Campground located on Route 16 towards New Hampshire.

Cupsuptic Lake

The launch for this lake is located on Route 16 towards New Hampshire 5.5 miles down on the right. There is a blue sign that reads State Boat Launch!

Richardson Lake

On Route 16 heading towards New Hampshire you'll see a sign for the Mill Brook landing for Upper Richardson lake. Access to popular fishing areas such as Upper Dam and Middle Dam can be gained through here. Keep following the trail for about a mile to get to the boat launch!

Public Launches-Smaller Bodies of Water

Quimby Pond

Follow Route 4 towards Oquossoc for 4.7 miles. Turn right onto Quimby Pond Road. Follow for 1.5 miles and turn left onto Chestnut Ln. The public boat launch sign is on the right. No motorboats here but perfect for fly fishing!

Sandy River Ponds

From our office, follow Route 4 South towards Farmington. Follow for 8 miles, and you'll see a dirt pull-off to the left. There's a sign for Sandy River Ponds. No motorboats allowed!

Haley Pond

Located right in downtown Rangeley. Swimming, kayaking, canoeing, fishing, and motorboats with less than 6 horsepower are all allowed here! The boat launch is located just off Main Street, behind Haley Pond Park and Rangeley Adventure Co.

Saddleback Lake

As you pull into the Saddleback Lake Lodge community, follow the sign that says boat access to the left. Keep left and follow the trail to the launch.

No motorboats are allowed here!

Dodge Pond

Located between Rangeley and Oquossoc sits Dodge Pond. A smaller body of water in the area, but big enough for motorboat access! The boat launch is about 3.5 miles North of downtown Rangeley on Route 4.

Loon Lake

A very quiet, pristine lake where you can hear the loons call throughout your visit. 4 miles up Loon Lake Road, after the road turns to dirt on the left. No motorboats are allowed on this lake!

Explore with a Canoe or Kayak

Canoeing and kayaking are very popular sports in the area, not only because they are a great workout, but they are quieter than motorboats and better for scenic viewing! In addition, there are no restrictions on where canoes and kayaks may venture!

Self-Guided Canoe and Kayak Trips

<u>Cupsuptic River:</u> For a short trip about 1 to 2 hours with easy-in/easy-out access, try Cupsuptic River! Take Route 4 towards Oquossoc to the information Pavilion. Turn right on Route 16 towards Wilsons Mills, continue across the Kennebago River, past the Cupsuptic River. Do not cross the bridge - landing is on the east side. About 1 mile up the river on the west side is "Hinkley's Cafe" where camping and a picnic area are available. ¾ mile further up the river on the left is a cabin called Mooch's. At this point, passage becomes impossible due to rocks and small falls. Turn around and return.

<u>Magalloway River:</u> This trip requires a car shuttle and is a 5.5 mile (approximately 3 hour) paddle. Take Route 4 towards Oquossoc to the Information Pavilion. Turn right on Route 16 to Wilson's Mills. At Wilson's Mills as you approach the bridge, turn right on Bennett Road. Immediately on left is the launching point. There is fast water at the start, but it is flat.

Shuttle: Take a car to the bridge at the Maine/NH border - there is only 1 bridge which crosses the river.

Take out at bridge - it is quite steep.

Kennebago River: This is a very popular trip, as it is close to Rangeley and offers a great opportunity to see moose and other wildlife! Approximately 3 miles, this trip also requires a shuttle. Take Route 4 towards Oquossoc to the Information Pavilion. Turn right on Route 16 and proceed 1.3 miles to Kennebago River Road on the right. Proceed 2 miles on this gravel road to the so-called Steep Bank Pool on the left. You will see a path for launching at this point, park on the right side of the road. There is a ledge around the first bend, which should be approached to determine whether to run it on the left, or right side. You may have to carry over this under certain weather conditions/or degrees of your skills.

After this it is flat water to the Route 16 bridge. Take out on east bank immediately after bridge. **Shuttle:** Go back to Route 16, turn right, and proceed 0.10 miles. Park on the left side before the bridge. **Dead River - North Branch:** 3.4 mile paddle (Approximately 2 hours) requiring a shuttle and a portage.

Take Route 16 east to Stratton, then turn left on Route 27. Continue north, past Cathedral Pines Campground. About 1 and a ½ miles past Eustis, turn right on King and Bartlett Road. Turn right at the

King and Bartlett sign, cross the bridge, launching on the left immediately after the bridge. Park on the right side of the road.

Shuttle: leave vehicle at the Cathedral Pines Campground. Portage: The portage (approximately 100 yards) is around a dam marked by a cable with barrels strung across the river. Pull out on the right where the cable is anchored. To the left is a path. 100 yards below is a place for reentry. Continue to Cathedral Pines.





The Rangeley Lakes Region is an accessible wilderness as vast as it is beautiful. It's the home of world-class trout and landlocked salmon fishing. Emerse yourself in one of Rangeley's sparkling lakes, ponds, streams, or rivers surrounded by breathtaking forest-clad mountains. A place of such extraordinary beauty that the angler does well to attend to his fishing. The pristine Rangeley Lakes are known as the birthplace of contemporary fly-fishing!

Biking Trails

THE RAILROAD LOOP TRAIL

This trail starts off on Route 4, on a gravel road just south of the Rangeley Inn. The trail is marked and is a 12.5 mile mountain bike loop. It has a good mixture of terrain and offers some great views of Rangeley Lake and the mountains. It is a nice ride; however, the last half has many long uphill's.

Saddleback Mountain Biking

EAST KENNEBEGO MOUNTAIN

The 3 mile trail is not only a nice, scenic hike, but also offers a challenge to those who wish to bring their mountain bike! To find the trail, go 10 miles east of Rangeley on Route 16. Turn left on a gravel road, cross the bridge, and then take a right (5.3 miles from the bridge). The trail begins at the East Kennebago Snowmobile sign.

RANGELEY LAKES TRAIL CENTER

The Rangeley lakes Trails
Center is located at 524
Saddleback Mountain Road and offers seven miles of trails for mountain biking! In difficulty rating, 2 miles are easy (to steel bridge and back along Tote Road). The remainder is suggested for advanced mountain bikers.

Many of the area's woods roads provide excellent riding.

Starting Memorial Day Weekend, Saddleback Mountain will be offering mountain bike and safety equipment rentals, lessons, and guided tours on the existing network of single-trail bike trails. 

Scenic Drive Ideas

The Coos Canyon Cruise- Driving time approximately 2 1/2 hours

Ride South on Route 17, a National Scenic Highway, stopping at Noyes Overlook on left and Height of Land Scenic turnout on right. Continue South to Coos Canyon, a GREAT place to take a dip, take some photos and explore! Check out Coos Canyon Rock and Gift Shop serving hand-dipped hard serve ice-cream, snacks, beverages, rocks, crystals, jewelry, and more! Continue on the route, turning right on Route 120 West to Andover, then take Route 5 South to Route 2. Turn right on Route 2 West and take Route 26 North, stopping at Grafton Notch State Park and see Screw Auger Falls. Continue on Route 26 to Errol and take Route 16 East back to Rangeley.

The Kingfield Joyride- Driving time approximately 2 hours

Take Route 16 East to Stratton and Routes 16 & 27 south to Sugarloaf Mountain and Carrabassett Valley. Continue on to Kingfield and watch for signs by a bridge spanning the Carrabassett River for Public Scenic Overlook called Ira Mountain. This road is narrow but the view is worth the trip. In Kingfield take Route 27 south to see Wire Bridge (watch for signs) in New Portland, and take Route 234 back to Route 4. Take Route 4 North and stop at Small's Falls (State Rest Area) and hike short trails to another set of falls if you'd like! Continue on Route 4 North to Rangeley.

<u>Stratton Site Seeing - Driving time approximately 2.5 hours</u>

Take Route 16 East to Stratton. At 7.3 miles turn right on Oddy's Road for Quill Hill scenic view. It is 4.5 miles to top, the road is gravel but in good shape. Views are spectacular Continue on Route 16 to Stratton. Turn left on Route 27 North to Cathedral Pines Campground. Across from the campground entrance turn left on Eustis Ridge Road and continue to small picnic area for views of the Bigelow Mountains. Return to Route 27 and continue north on 27 passing beautiful Chain of Ponds to Canadian border. If you wish, go on to Lac Megantic, a Canadian city on Lake Megantic. You must have a passport. Follow same route back to Rangeley. Driving time to border approximately 50 minutes.

The Sandy River Spin-Driving time approximately 2 hours

Take Route 4 South towards Phillips. Twelve miles south, stop at Rest Area Smalls Falls for a picnic and walk on the trails around the falls. Continue on route 4 South. Turn right on Route 142, past Mt. Blue State Park, on to Dixfield. Take Route 2 West to Scenic Route 17 North to Oquossoc, Route 4 to Rangeley.

Quick Trips to Scenic Vistas



Quill Hill

Take Route 16 East. At 7.3 miles turn right on Oddy's Road for Quill Hill scenic view. It is 4.5 miles to top, the road is gravel but in good shape. Views are spectacular! You can find more information at <u>quillhillmaine.com</u>.

Height of the Land

Arguable the most iconic view in the Rangeley area! The sweeping views of the Rangeley Lakes and the mountains surrounding our area make this an incredible view no matter what time of the season it is. From our office, head towards Oquossoc. Once in Oquossoc, turn left on to Route 17 and follow for about 11 miles. You will arrive to the full and unforgettable views from the Height of the Land on the right! Shelton Noyes Overlook

From our office, head out towards Oquossoc. Once in Oquossoc, turn left on to Route 17 and follow for 5 miles. On the left you will see the Noyes Overlook, offering eastward views of Rangeley Lake and beautiful views of both Bald and Saddleback mountains!

Whip Willow Farm Overlook

Just one mile away from our office in Downtown Rangeley, head south on Route 4 towards Farmington. This overlook will be on your right after you pass the IGA. The Whip Willow Farm Overlook is well known for the spot to be at to watch the sun set over Rangeley Lake!

Good Spots For A Picnic

Coos Canyon, 472 Swift River Road, Byron ME 04275

Located 20 miles southeast of Oquossoc on Route 17. Great spot for a picnic, swimming, or exploring!

Smalls Falls

Located on Route 4 about 12 miles south of Rangeley. There are a number of falls and short trails along with picnic tables, grills, restrooms, and a great swimming spot.

<u>Hatchery Brook Trail</u>

This is a short, flat walking loop about a mile long with picnic tables on the lake! From our office, head north on Route 4 towards Oquossoc for about 0.75 miles. After you pass Looney Bin Variety and Moose Alley, turn left onto Rangeley Manor Drive. The Hatchery Brook Trail parking will be on the left.

Town Park

You can access the park off Main Street on either Lake Street or Park Road. There are a number of covered picnic tables on the shore of Rangeley Lake, as well as grills, restrooms, swings and the town beach and boat launch.

State Park


The State Park is located on South Shore Drive just off Route 4 about 3 miles south of Rangeley. The 750 acre wooded park offers both swimming and picnic areas, restrooms, hiking trails, and kids play area.

Cupsuptic Lake Park, 960 Wilson Mills Road, Rangeley ME 04970

Located off of Route 16 just west of the Oquossoc Village area. Recent renovations to this site make it a perfect spot to take your family for the day and enjoy picnic tables and a nice beach for swimming. Small fee to enter this park.

Easy Hiking / Walking



Hatchery Brook Preserve

Containing 50 forested acres on Russell Cove with a network of wetlands providing critical habitat to wildlife. The 12 mile trail system includes 3 picnic spots along the water, a boat dock for water access, and a series of bog bridges that protect plant and animal life while providing easy access over several different types of wetlands!

<u>Total Distance:</u> 1.2 miles Network

Hiking difficulty: Easy

Pets: Permitted - Please look after and clean up after your pet

<u>How to get there:</u> From our office, head north on Route 4 towards Oquossoc for about 0.75 miles. After you pass Looney Bin Variety and Moose Alley, turn left onto Rangeley Manor Drive. The Hatchery Brook Trail parking will be on the left.



Easy Hiking / Walking (Cont.)

Hunter Cove Wildlife Sanctuary

This trail system is on 100 acres of forested lands bordering Rangeley Lake. The trails lead out to a beautiful section of Hunter cove on Rangeley Lake with a few benches for picnic opportunities. The property hosts an abundance of habitats for song birds, wading birds, and amphibians. There is even a deer wintering area, as well as a popular bird watching area! Brace yourself to get your feet wet, as there are several wet areas with bog bridging.

Total Distance: 1.8 miles Network

Hiking difficulty: Easy

Pets: Permitted - Please look after and clean up after your pet

<u>How to get there:</u> From our office, head out towards Oquossoc for 3.3 miles. Look for the Hunter Cove Wildlife Sanctuary sign and parking on the left.

Wilhelm Reich Museum Trails

The trail network is part of the Orgonon Estate, 3.3 miles of woodland nature trails provide easy to moderate walking and hiking year-round! The trails highlight many interesting features of the property, including Wilhelm Reich's laboratory and observatory, his tomb, an outdoor classroom, and a trail of famous quotes! The trails are open daily from

8:00 a.m. to 5:00 p.m. A paper map of the trails is available at the conference center near the parking lot.

The grounds are also open to picniking during the summer time.

Total distance: 3.3 miles Network

Hiking difficulty: Easy

Pets: Permitted - Please look after and clean up after your pet

How to get there:

From our office, follow the main road to Oquossoc for about 3.6 miles. At that time, you should see Dodge Pond Road on your right. Turn right and follow Dodge Pond Road for about half a mile until you reach the entrance to Orgonon.

Sabbathday Pond Loop

The hike in Sabbathday Pond Shelter, along the shore of Long Pond and back over Spruce Mountain, will give you a chance to sample the serene beauty of the isolated Four Ponds area. This is not a demanding hike, most of the hike is level ground skirting Long Pond. The loop makes an excellent day hike, with a pause at the shelter for lunch.

Total Distance: 6 miles (a circuit hike)

Hiking difficulty: Easy

<u>How to get there:</u> The trailhead is located on ME 17, 11.8 miles south of Oquossoc and 6 miles south of the Appalachian Trail. The trail crossing is well marked and there is parking on the west side of the road.

Easy Hiking / Walking (Cont.)

Spencer Pond

This short hike to Spencer Pond Southeast of Mooselookmeguntic Lake has pretty views and is open to fly fishing in the summer for coldwater gamefish! It's a gentle climb along an old woods road.

Total Distance: 1.1 Miles Round Trip

Hiking difficulty: Easy

<u>How to get there:</u> From our office, follow Route 4 to Oquossoc. When you get to Oquossoc, turn onto Route 17 and follow for about 13 miles. You will pass Height of the land, and the parking for the Spencer Pond trailhead will be a couple miles after that

on the left.

Bonney Point Trail

Although much of the 280-acre property is primarily forested, evidence of its agricultural history can be seen in its meadows, old stone walls, wire fencing, and livestock watering wells. With over a half-mile of frontage on Rangeley Lake, the property hosts diverse habitats for song birds, wading birds, amphibians, beaver, bear, deer and more! In late summer, the fields produce an abundance of wildflowers and berries enjoyed by hikers and many types of wildlife!

Total Distance: 1.13 Mile Loop

Hiking difficulty: Easy

How to get there: From our office, follow Route 4 towards Oquossoc for about 5 miles. After you pass the 2nd entrance for Mingo Loop Road, you will see Bonney Point Road. Take a left onto Bonney Point Road. Follow for about 3/4 of a mile and the trailhead will be on the left.

Maine Forestry Museum

The trail is mostly flat and explores wetlands and the pond shore. There are several trails intersecting on the property. Historians will enjoy an old Homestead cellar near the south end of the trail network. The Northern Forest Canoe Trail uses the property and also maintains a first-come first-serve lean-to and fire pit near Gull Pond Stream. Bicycles are welcome!

<u>Total Distance:</u> 2.6 Miles Network

Hiking difficulty: Easy

How to get there: From our office follow Route 4 for 0.2 miles and then turn right onto Pleasant Street. At the four way another 0.2 miles away, turn right onto Route 16 heading towards Stratton. Stay on this road for a mile and the Maine Forestry Museum will be on your right. The trails are accessed on the lower grounds behind the pavilion.



Easy Hiking To Moderate Hiking

For those looking for more challenging hikes, here are some trail options with more areas and views to explore!



Mingo Springs Trail and Bird Walk

A 2 mile walk through various forest types with excellent wildlife viewing! The trail works around the Mingo Springs Golf Course, with two miles on the back nine holes and 1.4 miles of the trail at the front. You will be hiking through both hardwood and softwood trees, wetlands, and open fields. This trail has ample opportunity to see wildlife such as deer, birds, and amphibians. You can also walk through an immense field of lupine on the front end of the trail!

Total Distance: 3.4 Mile Loop

Hiking difficulty: Easy to Moderate

Pets: Permitted - Please look after and clean up after your pet

How to get there: Head towards Oquossoc. Drive for about 2.2 miles and turn left on to Mingo Loop Road. Continue for about 1/2 a mile, then turn left onto Alpine Way. You will see the maintenance shack for Mingo Springs Golf Course on the left, and you will park on the grass area to the left of that shack. Walk a short distance back to the intersection of Alpine Way and Mingo Loop Road to access the trail head.

South Bog Conservation Area

This trail offers you 2 unique trail experiences! One is a short interpretive trail highlighting the conservation area's rich natural resources and a stream restoration effort and a longer extension to a hand-carry boat launch on Rangeley Lake.

The trail follows the eastern side of the South Bog Stream to a stream restoration project completed by the Maine Department of Inland Fisheries and Wildlife. The longer extension leaves from the western side of the stream just after the stream crossing and goes approximately 2 miles to the picnic area along the shores of Rangeley Lake.

Both trails offer expansive views of Rangeley Lake!

<u>Total Distance:</u> 2.6 Miles Network <u>Hiking difficulty:</u> Easy to Moderate

Pets: Permitted - Please look after and clean up after your pet

<u>How to get there:</u> Follow route 4 out of town towards Farmington for 3.5 miles. You will see South Shore Drive on the right, turn onto that road. Follow South Shore Drive for 5.3 miles and parking for the trail will be on the right.

Rangeley River Trail

This short section of shared-use trail provides access to the shores of the Rangeley River and Mooselookmeguntic Lake for hikers, anglers, and bikers. Two stream-side picnic tables and 0.5 mile side trail to the lake allows trail users to explore the Rangeley River area at their own pace. After crossing the Rangeley River at its northern point, visitors can venture down the narrow gauge railroad bed which runs across the steep opposite bank of the river.

<u>Total Distance:</u> 1.3 miles Network <u>Hiking difficulty:</u> Easy to Moderate

Pets: Permitted - Please look after and clean up after your pet

<u>How to get there:</u> Head into Oquossoc & park in the lot to the left. The trail head is on Hatchery Road, about 0.2 miles behind Oquossoc Grocery. Walk past the gate that blocks automobile access to the hiking and biking trail.

Easy Hiking To Moderate Hiking (Cont.)

Angel Falls

An easy to moderate 1.1 mile hike with an elevation of about 200 feet. This short hike includes crossing several mountain streams, leading to one of the highest and most impressive waterfalls in Maine! One of the more popular trails in our area that can be very busy on the weekends between 9:00 a.m. and 4:00 p.m. While this trail can be easy, there are several stream crossings, high water from streams, and rock hopping that may pose a challenge to some!

<u>Total Distance:</u> 1.1 miles Round trip <u>Hiking difficulty:</u> Easy to Moderate

Pets: Permitted - Please look after and clean up after your pet

How to get there: From our office, head out to Oquossoc and turn left onto Route 17. Follow for 3.7 miles to which you will turn right onto Herbie Welch Trail. Follow for about a mile until you come to a four-way intersection. Turn left at the four-way onto Bemis Road. Follow Bemis Road for about 11 miles (use caution as this gravel road can be bumpy with rough spots). Look for a road going sharply right and downhill and follow it into an old gravel pit. There will also be a large boulder with graffiti. Park in that area.

Cascade Stream Gorge Trail

This quick 1 mile trail offers excellent views, sights to wildlife, and picknicking opportunities as it follows the gorge of Cascade Stream to a series of beautiful waterfalls! The trail leads into the 90-foot deep gorge of the Cascade Stream providing access to a series of waterfalls and chutes.

<u>Total Distance:</u> 1 mile Loop <u>Hiking difficulty:</u> Easy to Moderate

Pets: Permitted - Please look after and clean up after your pet

How to get there: From our office, head out of town south on Route 4 towards Farmington. you will drive for about 3.5 miles until you come to the intersection of South Shore Drive and Cascade Road. Turn left onto Cascade Road. Shortly after the road ends at a T-intersection with Town Hall Road. Take a left, then an immediate right (look for a Rangeley Lakes Heritage Trust marker in the trees). Go up the steep driveway, bearing right, to the parking area and trailhead.

<u>Hunter Cove Uplands</u>

From the parking lot, a multi-use trail offers easy hiking with a nice, flat surface with only one or two hills. There are two loops that are attached to the multi-use trail. One is a smaller loop that uses both old logging roads and a hand-cut trail that make it a moderately difficult hike. The other is the upper loop that is exclusively hand-cut that also has moderately difficult hiking. This longer loop truly immerses the hiker in the woods, nature, and wildlife that Hunter Cove Uplands provides!

Total Distance: 2.8 Miles Network

Hiking difficulty: Moderate

Pets: Permitted - Please look after and clean up after your pet

How to get there:

From our office, follow Route 4 towards Oquossoc for about 4 miles. On the left you will see a sign labeled "Hunter Cove Uplands". Arrive there and the parking lot will be on the left.

Moderate Hiking To Advanced



For those looking for more challenging hikes, here are some trail options with more areas and views to explore!

Bald Mountain

There's no better place to get the feel of the Rangeley Region than hiking Bald Mountain! Along a low summit, Bald Mountain in Oquossoc provides some of the best lake views in Maine. Nestled on an arm of land between Rangeley lake and Mooselookmeguntic lake, Bald Mountain delivers a satisfying perspective on both the waterways of the area, and the dozens of mountains that surround them. This is a busy trail system, especially on the weekends between 9:00 a.m. - 4:00 p.m.!

Total Distance: 2.3 miles Network

Hiking difficulty: Moderate to Advanced

Pets: Permitted - Please look after and clean up after your pet

How to get there: Head north on ME 4 from Oquossoc. One mile north of Oquossoc Village, you will turn onto Bald Mountain Road. Follow Bald Mountain Road for another mile to trail markers on the left side of the road, a short distance beyond the signs for Bald Mountain Camps. Park in the Bald Mountain parking area.

Forest Legacy Trails

An eight mile network on the east side of Mooselookmeguntic and Cupsuptic Lakes with chances to watch wildlife, swim, and enjoy nature! Cut off trails also provide an opportunity to shorten the trek significantly, giving different level hikers the chance to enjoy the trails! A total of four lake-front campsites are connected by the trails, managed by the Stephen Phillips Memorial Preserve. They are available for use with permission from the Rangeley Lakes Heritage Trust.

Total Distance: 8.5 miles Network

Hiking difficulty: Moderate to Advanced

Pets: Permitted - Please look after and clean up after your pet

<u>How to get there:</u> Head towards Oquossoc. Just before you get into the village, take a right onto Route 16 towards Errol, NH. Stay on this road for 9.1 miles, then take a left on to Mud Pond Road. Keep on this road for about half a mile until you come to the parking lot. The trail head will be across form the parking area.

<u>Applachain Trail - Piazza Rock</u>

A popular, moderate hike with interesting rock formations to explore! According to the geological notes about this area "The granite of Saddleback is jointed into huge building blocks. An unusually large one has slid out of its place in the mountain side and, instead of breaking and skating down the slope like the others, has balanced across another block to create one-half of a cantilever bridge, forming Piazza Rock."

A pleasant, ideal family hike with a few stream crossings!

Total Distance: 4.1 miles Round trip


Hiking difficulty: Moderate to Advanced

Pets: Permitted - Please look after and clean up after your pet

How to get there: From our office, head out of town south on Route 4 towards Farmington. Follow the road until you come to the "s-turns" and you will see the parking area for the Appalachain Trails on the right. Park in the lot and carefully cross Route 4 to the access the trail head.

Advanced Hiking

These hikes are no joke, be prepared with necessary equipment and refreshments! The views and experiences will be worth the work you put in, and more!



West Kennebago Mountain

West Kennebago Mountain couldn't be better situated if it tried. The long ridge rises far back in paper company woodlands a good 10 miles from the embellishment of civilization (such as the nearest tarred road).

Only 10 miles from Canada on its north side, the mountain is one of the eastern links in a long horseshoe-shaped range of hills that runs down from Seven Ponds, through the Upper and Lower Cupsuptic, and back up

to Oxbow. The views are splendid.

Total Distance: 4.5 miles (a return hike)

Hiking time: 3 hours

Hiking difficulty: Advanced

How to get there: Go first to the Maine Forest Service Station at Toothaker Brook, 4.5 miles north and west of Oquossoc on ME 16. Proceed west from the station 3 miles on ME 16. Turn right onto a gravel tote road. This route (Old Cupsuptic Tote Road) proceeds through former Brown Company timberlands for 2 miles, where you turn right. Continue this right-hand gravel road for just over 2 miles, where you again bear right onto a wide, well groomed gravel road that runs towards the northeast. Proceed eastward 7 miles, watching on the left of the road for a small sign that indicates the trail to the fire tower. Park your car well off the road, this is a route for heavy logging trucks.

Saddleback Mountain

Saddleback, from a distance, lies like a sleeping giant southwest of Rangeley. It is a great mountain with several open summits, two of which are more than 4,000 feet high. It's main summit is barren and exposed so that windy, wet weather on the mountain can be hazardous. Even on warm, calm days in the valley, the upper reaches of Saddleback above Eddy Pond can prove cold and treacherous. Although a shorter trail reaches the summit from the ski area on the northwest side of the mountain, a far more interesting if lengthier approach can be made via the Applachain Trail. This route affords a full days hiking in attractive backcountry woodlands well populated with deer, moose, bear, and fox. It is one of the best extended day hikes in Western Maine!

<u>Total Distance:</u> 11.4 miles (a return hike)

<u>Hiking time:</u> 7.5 hours <u>Hiking difficulty:</u> Advanced

<u>How to get there:</u> 30 miles north of Farmington or 9 miles south of Rangeley. Park in the lot situated west of the highway. Carefully cross ME Route 4 to head northbound on the A.T.



Moose, deer, and other wild animals are typically active in the hours of dawn, dusk, and dark. Early morning and evening drives on any of the local roads can result in an unforgettable encounter.



Moose and Deer Hot Spots

Route 16 from Rangeley towards Stratton. Just before you reach the village of Stratton there are two sand pits where the moose tend to dine in the evening and latenight hours. Also be on the lookout for deer as they are easily spooked and may jump into the road quickly. Go slow, enjoy the ride, and see what you may find!

Route 16 from Oquossoc to Errol, NH. This is also a great road for moose, deer, and wild turkey! Keep your eyes wide because the moose tend to hang out on the sides of the roads!

Route 17 between Oquossoc and Rumford. If you leave before dark you might even be able to catch the sunset over Mooselookmeguntic Lake from the Height of the Land!

Route 4 between Rangeley and Phillips.

If you didn't already see some wildlife on your travels here, the main route into Rangeley is best known for moose and deer! Head out of Rangeley towards Farmington, after you come out of the "s-curves" right before double lane hill/smalls falls area is a hot spot for Moose. Road salt finds its way into the ditches in the spring after the snow melts, and Moose LOVE salt. They hang out inside the guard rails and enjoy the treat!

Once you reach Phillips, the hollow before Alpacaville is also hot for Moose!
